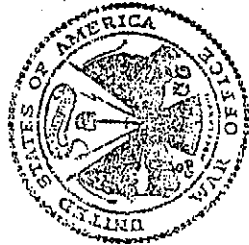

AWARD OF THE DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS

TC 439. The following AWARDS are announced.

Awarded: Distinguished Flying Cross

Date of service: 14 December 1969

Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Authority: By direction of the President under the provisions of the Act of Congress, approved 1926, AR 672-5-1 and USAFV Reg 672-1 dated 1 July 1969.

Organization: 128th Aviation Company (Assault Helicopter), APO 96289


Reason: For heroism while participating in aerial flight evidenced by voluntary actions above and beyond the call of duty: These men distinguished themselves by exceptionally valorous actions aboard a helicopter on a reconnaissance mission. Observing several enemy personnel searching for cover in a dense patch of palm trees, they swiftly directed the aircraft commander to the exact spot. Immediately, they marked the enemy targets with smoke so that a rocket run could be made on it. During the ensuing fire fight, they continually exposed themselves to the hail of enemy fire to mark and engage enemy bunkers and personnel. As friendly troops were being inserted into the contact area, they placed heavy volumes of fire on the enemy locations to cover the insertion and the other aircraft. Their quick professional reactions and courage under fire contributed greatly to the success of the mission. Their actions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military and reflect great credit upon themselves, their unit, and the United States Army.
